Flu Variant

The flu is a contagious respiratory infection caused by a virus.

All flu vaccines for the 2025–2026 season will be trivalent, which means they include three vaccine viruses. This means they are formulated to protect against three main types of viruses.

This flu variant is the cause of extreme cases which can lead to hospitalization.

The 2025–2026 flu vaccine isn't a perfect match for this variant but it does offer protection against severe cases.

Signs and Symptoms

- Chills
- Cough
- Fatigue or weakness
- Fever over 100 degrees
- Headaches
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Sore throat
- Some may have vomiting and diarrhea mostly seen in children

Risks

- People who are Native American or Alaska Native, Black, or Latino.
- Being 2 years or younger
- Adults over 65 years of age
- Some chronic diseases such as asthma and other lung diseases, diabetes, heart disease and history of a stroke

Precautions that help prevent or lower chances of getting the flu are:

- Receiving the flu vaccine
- Washing hands/ use hand sanitizer
- Avoid touching your face
- Cover your cough or sneezing with tissue or elbow
- Avoid crowds
- Clean surfaces Information

First Fruit Giving

First Fruits, Tithes, and Offerings: Beginning the Year God's Way

As we enter a new year, Scripture reminds us that **how we begin matters to God**. In the biblical witness, beginnings are sacred because they reveal priority, trust, and lordship. *"For if the firstfruit is holy, the whole is also holy."* — **Romans 11:16**

Our theme for this season calls us to align not only our words and plans, but also our **worship and stewardship** with God's purposes.

Three Distinct Biblical Acts of Giving

Scripture presents **three distinct but connected expressions of giving: First Fruits, the Tithe, and the Offering**. Each serves a different theological purpose.

1. First Fruits: Honoring God at the Beginning –

Biblical foundation: ~Exodus 23:19 ~Deuteronomy 26:1–11 ~Proverbs 3:9–10 ~Romans 11:16

What it is:

First Fruits is the **first and best portion** given to God **before the full harvest is realized**. It is an act of **faith and consecration**, declaring that God is first and trusted with what is to come. Israel brought First Fruits at the start of the season, not knowing the outcome, saying in effect: "God, You are our source, not our surplus."
"Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the firstfruits of all your increase." — **Proverbs 3:9**

What it does:

First Fruits consecrates the whole. When the first portion is set apart for God, everything connected to it is placed under His authority and blessing.

2. The Tithe: Returning What Belongs to God –

Biblical foundation: ~Leviticus 27:30 ~Malachi 3:8–10 ~Matthew 23:23 ~Hebrews 7:8

What it is:

The tithe is **one-tenth of income**, returned to God **after increase is received**. Scripture does not present the tithe as generosity, but as **faithful obedience**. *"The tithe... belongs to the Lord."* — **Leviticus 27:30**
In the New Testament, Jesus is our High Priest after the order of Melchizedek, and Scripture teaches that our tithes testify that He lives and reigns (Hebrews 7:8).

What it does:

The tithe establishes order, sustains the work of the church, and releases God's promise of provision and protection (Malachi 3:10).

3. The Offering: Giving from a Willing Heart – *Biblical foundation:* ~2 Corinthians 9:6–7 ~Luke 6:38 ~Matthew 5:23–24

What it is:

An offering is **anything given beyond the tithe**, prompted by gratitude, generosity, or specific purpose. It is voluntary, Spirit-led, and deeply connected to the **condition of the heart**. *"Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion."* — **2 Corinthians 9:7** Jesus teaches that offerings carry the **spiritual posture of the giver** (Matthew 5:23–24). What is in the heart is attached to what is placed on the altar.

What it does:

Offerings express worship, love, and partnership with God's work beyond obligation.

How These Three Work Together:

1. First Fruits honors God **at the beginning** **2. The Tithe** honors God **consistently** **3. Offerings** honor God **generously**

Together, they form a holistic, biblical pattern of stewardship that moves us beyond survival into **faithful mission**.

First Fruits must be **intentional**. It is not what is left over, nor what is convenient. When you receive your first income of the year—paycheck, pension, business income, or other increase—you prayerfully ask the Holy Spirit, "Lord, what would You have me give as First Fruits?" That offering is given **first, once, and above the tithe**, as a declaration that God is first this year. *This requires faith. Scripture never presents First Fruits as casual—it is a trust statement.* *"Seek first the kingdom of God..."* — **Matthew 6:33**

ALL IN: From Maintenance to Ministry & Mission

Maintenance asks, "Will this be enough?" Faith declares, "God is enough." First Fruits shifts our posture from holding tightly to what we have, to trusting God with what is ahead. When God is honored first, the church is positioned not merely to maintain, but to **minister and to move in mission**.

The First Fruits Challenge: Pack the Pews Rally 2026

As we prepare for **Pack the Pews Rally 2026**, I invite you to participate in a **First Fruits offering** as a way of consecrating this year and this vision to God. This is not about equal amounts—it is about **equal obedience**.

"As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." — **Joshua 24:15**

Let's honor God first, trust Him fully, and believe that when the first is holy, **the whole will follow**.
